February -March	Attend a Volunteer Training session (90 minutes)
March 1st	Student application deadline
March 21st – April 6th	Read and score the applications for discussion and deliberation via online system
April 7th – 18th	In-person Preliminary Review team deliberation meetings (1 meeting @ 2 hrs)
May	Scholarship awards will be announced
July	Scholarship Celebration – all scholarship volunteers are invites to join us!

LOPRINZI SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Open to high school seniors

Criteria

Those who are of good character and citizenship in their school may apply if they meet the following:

- I. Demonstrated financial need to attend college or university using:
 - a. FAFSA to collect financial information
 - b. The student choice of school's COA (Cost of Attendance)
 - c. The student's financial information (Expected Family Contribution)
- II. Participation in competitive high school athletics;
- III. Exhibits strong character and leadership involvement in their school and community;
- IV. Minimum cumulative (unweighted) 3.0 GPA; and
- V. Enrollment full time at an accredited post-secondary education provider in the upcoming fallterm.

Opportunity

- The scholarship is open to all eligible students.
- Each program high school will have one student athlete as a finalist.
- Application materials and submission process are available online.
- In 2019, three scholarships were awarded for a total of \$24,000 to students from Jefferson, Roosevelt and Tualatin High Schools.

Process and Timeline

Individuals submit their application via the online system. Our preliminary review teams will evaluate and select one student from each high school to advance to the finalist round. Then the 2020 final review team will select the finalists for in person interviews. Final review team is made up of invited members selected by the MAF Scholarship committee.
